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

Applicants who wish to enroll in the Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN) program at Sampson Community College must meet the following requirements:

- Current CPR (American Heart Association - Basic Life Support Provider) Certification
- Current NC Nurse Aide Certification listed on NC Nurse Aide Registry
- Completion of the ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) (Proficient, Exemplary, or Advanced Level)
- Cumulative GPA of 2.0+
- Completion of CHM 092 and BIO 110 prior to admission. Completion of a Chemistry and Biology course from high school with a C or better within the last 10 years will satisfy this requirement.
- Completion of Tier 2 in MAT 003 or higher, placement test scores, or transition studies OR an unweighted high school GPA of 2.8 within the last 10 years.
- Completion of Tier 2 in ENG 002 or higher, placement test scores, or transition studies OR an unweighted high school GPA of 2.8 or higher in the last 10 years.
