The Associate in Science degree shall be granted for a planned program of study consisting of a minimum 60 semester hours of credit (SCH) of college transfer courses. Within the degree program, the institution shall include opportunities for the achievement of competence in reading, writing, oral communication, fundamental mathematical skills, and basic computer use.

The Comprehensive Articulation
Agreement (CAA) and the Independent
Comprehensive Articulation Agreement
(ICAA) enables North Carolina
community college graduates of the
two-year associate in arts programs who
are admitted to constituent institutions
of The University of North Carolina and
Signatory Institutions of North Carolina
Independent Colleges and Universities
to transfer with junior status.

Community College graduates must obtain a grade of "C" or better in each course and an overall GPA of at least 2.0 on a 4.0 scale in order to transfer with junior status. Courses may also transfer through bilateral agreements between institutions.





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
