Must be 16.5 to enroll, meet all requirements, and cover costs of background check, drug screen, etc. NAS 101 completers will sit for a 2-part certification exam (skills, written). After passing the exam, they will be listed on the Nurse Aide I registry. Upon completion of NAS 102, the instructor will submit the student's information to the Board of Nursing (NAS 101 required first).

Workforce Development & Continuing Education

Many opportunities for certifications exist through Workforce Development & Continuing Education (WD&CE). These opportunities do not award course credit but provide state/federal-recognized certifications. Examples include Truck Driver Training, Pharmacy Tech., EKG Tech., CNA 1, Vet Assisting, Phlebotomy, Fire Academy, EMR/EMT, Basic Welding, Masonry, IT Certifications, and much more.

CCP students are eligible for these WD&CE courses only in the 11th & 12th grade and must have the 2.8 unweighted GPA requirement. CCP students will pay any relevant course fees, but are responsible for the CCP student fee, not the listed tuition rate on the WDCE website. Please contact your career coach for more information.
