		SCC does not guarantee specific instructors for specific courses or sections.			
		Attendance in online courses is counted by the number of missed assignments.			
		Punctual and regular attendance at all class meetings is expected.			
		Students who do not complete the Mandatory Online Course Assessment (MOCA) or do not attend			
		class by the 10% date of the course will be withdrawn from the class.			
		Students whose absences exceed the allowed number per the instructor syllabus may be withdrawn			
		from the course by the instructor. Drops occurring before the 70% mark will reflect as a W; drops			
		occurring after the 70% mark will be a WF or WP and will impact the student's GPA per their local high			
		school's policy and in accordance with the SCC Student Handbook.			
		Grades earned at Sampson Community College will be reflected on the student's high school transcrip			
		and will be used in calculating their high school GPA.			
		All grades earned at SCC will become part of the student's permanent college transcript and will follow			
		them throughout their college career, including withdrawal grades.			
		Students who wish to drop or withdraw from a college course must have documented consent of their			
		high school principal or their designee.			
		Because college courses are academically rigorous, students should be prepared to spend a minimum			
		of 2-3 hours of study outside of class for each hour spent in class (# of credit hours).			
		Students are expected to read the syllabus for every class. The syllabus will explain course			
		assignments, requirements, grading and attendance policies, and more.			
		Students in college courses are always expected to conduct themselves with maturity and respect in			
		compliance with the Sampson Community College Student Handbook.			
		Students who have a concern about a course should first speak with their instructor.			
		Per FERPA (1974) <u>Parents/Guardians are NOT allowed to contact their student's instructor</u> .			
		They are instead encouraged to empower their student to advocate for themselves or contact their			
		Career Coach or high school counselor.			
		Students who have a diagnosed disability/504 Plan/IEP must self-identify to SCC. Students must self-			
		disclose to the Disability Services Coordinator (disability@sampsoncc.edu).			
		Any accommodations at the high school will not automatically follow them to SCC.			
		To maintain eligibility, students must maintain at least a 2.0 GPA in their college classes (after 2			
		courses) and must continue progressing toward high school graduation.

		Once a student is no longer enrolled in high school, they are no longer eligible for participation in the			
		Career & College Promise program. They must apply as a traditional student to enroll.
